Pre-requisites:

 LING 550 Theory and Practice of English Second Language Teaching This course is a prerequisite to almost every 600- and 700-level course in TESOL/Applied Linguistics. Applied students should take 550 during their first semester in the MA program.

C. Internship in ESL (3 units)

Students who lack ESL/EFL teaching experience are required to take the Internship as one of the elective courses; those with ESL/EFL teaching experience can choose another 3-unit open elective. Students are asked to consult with the graduate advisor to determine whether they need to take LING 740, the Internship course.

D. Open electives needed to fill a 31-unit degree program

E. Culminating experience (3 units)

Plan A: Thesis

Students who choose to complete a thesis must enroll in LING 799A (3 units), usually in the last semester of the program.

Plan B: Completion of M.A. Comprehensive Exams

Students who choose to take the Comprehensive exams must take a 3-unit open elective with the approval of the graduate advisor; they can also enroll in LING 799C (0 units).

Keep in mind the following:

- 1. Courses are 3 units each with the exception of Ling 600, which is only 1 unit; 31 units (11 courses) are needed to complete the MA program.
- 2. The pre-requisite course (LING 550) taken as part of M.A. coursework can count toward the 31 units required of the M.A. degree as an elective.
- 3. 400-level courses and LING 505 (Graduate Writing) do not count towards the M.A. degree.
- 4. Graduate-level linguistics courses are not offered during the summer.
